19	THE CHAIRMAN: Do you have
20	anything you wish to add to your
21	previous testimony?
22	MR. YDELFONSO: Yes. Well, it's
23	about the same. We have the property
24	in the rear yard is on a cliff, hill,
25	downhill, so it's not appropriate to

8	He just wants for his partner 10 more

13	approval, when he sells it, he could
14	put it back to the way it is right now
15	THE CHAIRMAN: Is there anyone
16	else wishing to speak in favor of the

20	work for the architect as well.
