3	THE CHAIRPERSON: This evening we
4	do have a public hearing, Case Number
5	23-15pb-a, application of Northwell
6	Health, Inc. for approval of an amended
7	site plan in connection with the change
8	of use of subject property from 100
9	percent general office use to 68
10	percent medical office use and 32
11	percent general office use.
12	Premises are known as 600
13	Community Drive, Manhasset, New York
14	and is designated as Section 3, Block
15	E, Lot 1136 on the Nassau County Land
16	and Tax Map.
17	Is there representation here on
18	behalf of the application?
19	MR. SAHN: Thank you so much.
20	Good evening, Chair, and members of the
21	Board. Michael Sahn, Sahn, Ward,
22	Braff, Coschignano, 333 Earle Ovington
23	Boulevard, Uniondale, New York. And
24	Mr. Levin, good evening to you.
25	MR. LEVIN: Good evening,

2	Michael. Nice to hear from you.
3	MR. SAHN: Likewise.
4	I am pleased to present this
5	application tonight on behalf of
6	Northwell Health. Joining me in the
7	hearing room are various
8	representatives of Northwell Health and
9	VHB which has prepared the plans that
10	are before the Board tonight. Also
11	present is my partner at the law firm,
12	Joseph Bjarnson.
13	This is an application as
14	indicated in the legal notice that was
15	read to change the site plan for this
16	particular property for a medical
17	office use of 68 percent of the space
18	in the building for medical use with
19	the remaining 32 percent to be for
20	THE CLERK: Excuse me for a
21	second. Tom, Ray Kotcher is present at
22	the meeting.
23	MR. LEVIN: Okay.
24	MR. KOTCHER: Excuse me. I'm

sorry.

2	MR. SAHN: My pleasure, and I'll
3	continue when you're settled.
4	The Board is familiar with this
5	property. It's in the C-1 District.
6	It has a total of 222,510 square feet.
7	MR. LEVIN: Can you speak more
8	into the microphone, please?
9	MR. SAHN: Yes. My apologies.
10	It has a total of 222,510 square feet
11	within the building. It is a
12	four-story building, and it comprises
13	of a lot of 8.94 acres.
14	With the proposed change in the
15	usage, 151,300 square feet of the
16	building would be used for medical
17	office use and the remainder 71,200
18	square feet for general office use, and
19	that general office use would be for
20	Northwell Health, not for the
21	third-party tenants.
22	Previously in Case 22-12za, the
23	Zoning Board granted various variances
24	to allow for this change, principally

among them an off-street parking

1 Northwell Health, Inc. variance. 2 In that application, the Board 3 permitted the change to be made with 4 999 spaces onsite, whereas tonight 5 after various reviews with the 6 7 Village's engineering consultant, there are 1,002 spaces onsite on the plan 8 that is before the Board. 9 With your permission and in a few 10 moments, I will ask Courtney Riley of 11 VHB to present the site plan in 12 particular. The site plan again is 13 something that's familiar with the 14 Board generally. 15 The last time the case was --16 this application was before the Board, 17 this property, was in February of 2018. 18 In that regard, the Board approved 19 changes to the parking layout on the 20 site, principally being to allow the 21 front of the site to be developed for 22 parking so that now circulation onsite 23

can go around the entire building.

3	additional changes for the proposal
4	tonight.
5	With that background and your
6	permission, I would like to ask
7	Courtney Riley to speak.
8	THE CHAIRPERSON: Yes, please.
9	MS. RILEY: Good evening. My
10	name is Courtney Riley. I am the
11	original leader in Glen Development
12	Civil Engineering at VHB Engineering
13	located at 100 Motor Parkway,
14	Hauppauge, New York.
15	As Michael said, this existing
16	four-story building is approximately
17	200,000 square feet and would remain
18	the same amount. There are some minor
19	changes we made to the site plan to
20	allow now for the 68 percent medical
21	office use and 32 percent general
22	office use.
23	Some of these minor improvements
24	are the rear of the building will have

now a canopy, a loading dock canopy, a

2	reconfiguration of the staff lot, a
3	reconfiguration of existing curb cut
4	exiting the lot.
5	MR. LEVIN: Excuse me, I'm having
6	trouble hearing you. Can you speak
7	more into the microphone?
8	MS. RILEY: Yes, sir. Is that
9	better?
10	MR. LEVIN: Yes, it is.
11	MS. RILEY: Sorry about that.
12	We've also received some comments
13	from the Village consultant, R & M
14	Engineering, and we have incorporated
15	some of those comments into the plan
16	that you are going to see today or at
17	least photos to further explain these
18	minor modifications that they
19	requested.
20	As mentioned before, we have
21	circulation starting at Community
22	Drive. So the existing entrance where
23	there's a traffic light today will
24	remain the same, patients, staff who

come through that traffic light, and

they could either come to the front of
the building which, again, as Michael
mentioned was just added recently or to
the rear of the building.

As you can see in the packets in
the exhibit that was distributed, we

As you can see in the packets in the exhibit that was distributed, we have color coded three things: One would be the physicians which will be in the parking garage. Two is the patients and visitors, and three is the staff. As you look at these plans you'll notice that what we're trying to do is essentially get the patients and any visitors into the building at the closest points. So as someone comes off that main access from Community Drive, they can, again, come to the back and go towards what we're calling as lot B, and the staff can go through lot A.

You'll notice in the rear of the property of lot A, there are security gates.

Sir, I'll get you a copy.

Northwell Health, Inc. So the staff lot is in blue. You'll see gates in the rear of that so the staff can come in, go through the gated access. And then one of the changes that you'll see is that we have currently existing onsite there's a curb cut, and that's a two-way curb cut right at the bottom of that staff exit. We are now converting that to just an exit only, so instead of it being two

ways, it is now one way.

As you'll notice in B, you can see this is for patients and visitors. One of the other modifications is if you went to the existing site today, you would see that the rear entrance at the building where we are adding a canopy that it would go from southbound to northbound, and we're modifying that. So based on the circulation of the plan, patients are able to come in, and if they are being dropped off, they can be dropped off at that back rear entrance.

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2 And we had to make some

3 modifications, and one of the

4 modifications we made is that we

5 actually will widen out the sidewalk to

6 allow for ADA accessibility as well as

7 a wider sidewalk in the rear of the

property. As you work yourself around

the building, there is also a loading

10 dock entrance, and then you can come

will be marked in red.

back through the front at another

12 entrance.

One other comment that was made by R & M was we have physician parking inside the parking garage. When we get to the parking garage, I'll fix the screen in a second, that's on the second page of your exhibit, you'll see some parking stalls for physicians, there's 24 parking of them, and those

Once again, with the patients and visitors being first and foremost primary, they will have access in and out of the garage.

2	If you went to the site today,
3	staff of Northwell goes into the
4	garage, they have a gated access.
5	Those gates would be removed, and
6	patients and visitors would have access
7	to it and physicians parking would only
8	be would only be if they were in
9	that spot.
10	MR. LEVIN: I'm not hearing
11	anything.
12	THE CHAIRPERSON: There's
13	technical difficulty.
14	MS. RILEY: I apologize, Mr.
15	Levin. My computer keeps timing out on
16	our screen here.
17	MR. LEVIN: No okay, I just
18	didn't know what's happening.
19	MS. RILEY: That's on us. So the
20	east canopy is located in the rear.
21	It's 20 feet wide by five foot long.
22	Again, it's at the visitor-patient
23	access for drop off. And this one way
24	access would include underneath that
25	canopy.

it's an existing loading dock, but it

only has one space, and there's some

ADA stalls. Those ADA stalls have now
been located at more appropriate places
at the entrances and within the garage,
and this now is about 50 feet long and
has six.

The largest truck that would even be located is a box truck is the largest truck that would be -- would come to the site.

THE CHAIRPERSON: Thank you.

MS. RILEY: As mentioned before, we did get a variance for 999 stalls. The site plans that were in your package that were provided originally did have 1,004 spaces.

Further comments from R & M, there was two spaces when they went to the existing site that are existing stalls that they wanted due to the maneuverability of a car that they thought be should be removed. Those two stalls I could show you on the plan, but I'll point to it in a second,

have been removed, and we are still

over the amount being 1,002 spaces now.

We are still meeting our 999 spaces.

Those spaces are there was one in the corner on the south side in here, a little hard to get into and out, and there was another existing stall that actually kind of poked out a little bit into the drive aisle, and so that has also been replaced.

And just going to the second picture on your exhibits, you'll see here where we have the physician parking. These are 24 spaces. This is for physicians if, God forbid, there's an emergency, we have to get them in quick. They will have red striping which was one of the final comments that the Village consultant made that we agree with and would put some red striping there.

At this point, this concludes my testimony. And as Michael mentioned, we have experts here if you have any

4	MR. SAHN: Thank you. As
5	Courtney mentioned, we have other
6	representatives of VHB including Pat
7	Lenihan who altered the traffic study
8	that was the subject of the original
9	variance application. He can answer
10	any additional questions.
11	But to sum up tonight's
12	presentation, the site plan that is
13	before the Board conforms to the Zoning
14	Board approved site for the parking
15	variance and the other variances and
16	incorporates the comments that we
17	received from R & M Engineering during
18	the course of their review of the
19	application.
20	We understand that the Nassau
21	County Planning Commission has not yet
22	ruled on the case and that they meet
23	tomorrow, and we understand that the

So where's the entrance?

3	a traffic signal that exists here.
4	THE CHAIRPERSON: Right, yes.
5	MS. RILEY: This is the only
6	entrance. There's now and this on
7	the south side of the building, this
8	exists as an exit only currently.
9	THE CHAIRPERSON: And will remain
10	as exit only?
11	MS. RILEY: And would remain. On
12	the staff lot, this is an entrance and
13	an exit. We are taking away the
14	entrance and making it an exit.
15	And this traffic signal is part
16	of the TIS is modified to ensure the
17	proper in-and-out flow from this
18	traffic light.
19	THE CHAIRPERSON: Okay. So if
20	you come that one entranceway, what is
21	the flow of traffic? Can you go to the
22	left or to the right?
23	MS. RILEY: Yes. So if
24	traffic when traffic enters, they
25	can go to the right to this entrance

They can come in to the parking garage which would also be here. can come in and go to the right and go to the rear of the property to drop off, and then they can -- staff would essentially come through go straight and down towards A. And obviously we put the staff at the furthest point away. And as part of the improvements, you'll see a small crosswalk with a stop sign that allows

12	As to how long it will take to
13	complete the interior renovations, I
14	don't know that we could give you an
15	exact number on that.
16	MR. KOTCHER: I was asking that
17	because Community Drive is a little bit
18	important, and I was curious what it
19	might do to impede emergency visits to
20	the hospital and so forth. That's all.
21	MR. SAHN: We don't anticipate
22	I don't anticipate any impact on that.
23	MR. SCHUBERT: I have one
24	question. Parking lot A with the

amount of people that will be using it,

2	comes 5 o'clock, how do you try to come
3	out onto Community Drive going up
4	towards the Expressway? Traffic now is
5	bad. What's going to happen when you
6	have 200 cars coming out approximately
7	at 5 o'clock? How is that going to
8	impair the traffic situation?
9	MR. SAHN: I'm going to ask
10	Mr. Lenihan from VHB to answer that.
11	That was part of the study.
12	MR. SCHUBERT: Because I know
13	right now, it's been bad.
14	MR. SAHN: It really will be the
15	same condition that now exists assuming
16	the building was fully occupied, and
17	that's not going to change. It's still
18	the same finite number of people.
19	But Mr. Lenihan, would you give
20	your appearance and respond to that.
21	MR. LENIHAN: Absolutely. Thank you,
22	Michael.
23	Good evening. Patrick Lenihan.
24	I am the director of transportation for
25	VHB's Long Island office, and I was

1 Northwell Health, Inc. 21 2 responsible for the traffic study that 3 was done to evaluate the application. Specifically to your question, 4 5 Miss Riley mentioned the traffic signal 6 that stayed and will remain, although 7 there will be a closure of the entrance 8 just to the north. 9 MR. LEVIN: Again, could you 10 speak in to the microphone, please? 11 MS. RILEY: I'm sorry, Mr. Levin. 12 I'm a little taller than that. 13 MR. LEVIN: They are adjustable. 14 MS. RILEY: The one thing that 15 came out of the traffic study which as 16 in regards to mitigation to changes 17 that should be made was actually at 18 that traffic light. So the traffic study looks at how many folks are going 19 20 to exit there in the p.m., and what we 21 find is we're going to do a small signal timing adjustment to make sure 22 23 that the folks leaving the site because there will be more, slightly more 24

leaving the site from that signalized

3	the change.
4	So we take some small amount of
5	signal timing and give it to the
6	driveway, and that cleans things up
7	nicely. It works rather well. So and
8	now, you know, everybody that leaves
9	the site and goes south will do so
10	under the protection of the traffic
11	signal. Okay? Thank you.
12	MR. SCHUBERT: Thank you.
13	THE CHAIRPERSON: Any other
14	questions, comments, concerns?
15	MR. SAHN: If not, that concludes
16	our presentation, and thank you again
17	for your consideration of the
18	application.
19	THE CHAIRPERSON: Thank you, Mr.
20	Sahn.
21	Is there anyone else here to
22	speak on behalf of the applicant?
23	Is there anyone here to speak
24	against the applicant?
25	Excellent, okay, thank you.
